“Cycles of Faith” – Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

It has been about 2,000 years since Jesus first called His disciples to follow Him, a time when His Jewish society was essentially divided into two groups – those who followed each and every law of the faith and those who weren’t so attentive to it. Today, we seem to have developed a knack for dividing ourselves among many other stark and diverse groups, whether it be wealth, politics, ethnicity, or religious affiliation, to name just a few.

Matthew was a tax collector, and before Jesus called him, he was considered a part of the society of sinners in the eyes of the religious leaders. So why did Jesus call him, and not one of those who obeyed every law of the Jewish faith? Why did He sit down with Matthew and others who needed guidance in their lives? Very simply, as Jesus put it, one does not see a physician if one is healthy. So too are we called to sit down with Jesus.

Matthew, and the others who followed Jesus, did what the Catechism calls “a radical reorientation of [his] whole life, a return, a conversion to God with all [his] heart” (CCC 1431). Because it is just not enough to say we are sorry for our past sins, the sacrament of reconciliation calls us to begin with a fresh dedication to living our lives each and every moment with the grace of God. Doing so, we will end worldly divisions and achieve the mercy He desires for us.

Prayer for the blessing of rain:

Almighty God, we are in need of rain. We realize now, looking up into the clear, blue sky, what a marvel even the



least drop of rain really is. To think that so much water can fall out of the sky, which now is empty and clear! We place our trust in You. We are sure that You know our needs. But You want us to ask You anyway, to show You that we know we are dependent on You. Look on our dry hills and fields, dear God, and bless them with the living blessing of soft rain. Then the land will rejoice, and the rivers will sing Your praises, and the hearts of men will be made glad. Amen.

Pray for vocations to the priesthood & religious life:

O Jesus, Good and Gentle Shepherd, grant that the men and women from our community, may have the grace and the courage to hear and answer Your call to the priesthood and religious life. Give them the wisdom to realize that life is a gift. Let them realize their life is part of Your plan.
