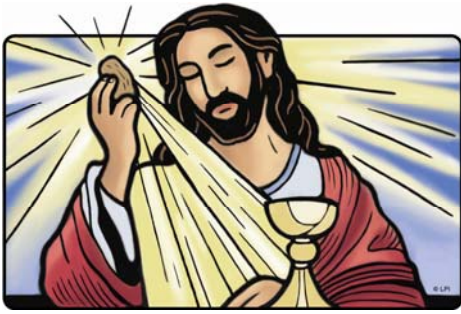


MAY 25, 2008: Body and Blood of Christ

This Friday, May 30, we celebrate the Feast of the

Sacred Heart. This feast is always celebrated on the Friday after the second Sunday after Pentecost. The Sacred Heart devotion has enriched and strengthened Catholic living. This devotion, using the traditional symbol of love, focuses on the self-sacrificing love of Jesus Christ for us humans. This devotion reminds us of the love we should return to the Lord, and calls on us to apologize for all human indifference and sinning. This devotion, since the 17th Century, has brought to Catholic living the act of reparation on this day, the monthly First Friday, the Holy Hour, perpetual adoration, enthronement of the Sacred Heart in the home, etc. With its solid theology, this devotion has a continuing lesson and warm appeal for Catholic Christians.



Today we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ – Corpus Christi. The sacrament of the Eucharist – Holy Communion – is central to our faith as Catholics. Sometimes people don't understand the teaching about Holy Communion and get confused about its reception.

The following is taken from the Liguori Publications bulletin letter called *Dear Padre*. It is reprinted here with permission from the Liguori Publications.

dear Padre

Are the sacraments only for Catholics?

Q. Our parish priest says, "You don't have to be Catholic to receive the sacraments of first Communion and first penance. You need only be baptized." In our parish, children who are baptized in the Lutheran, Episcopalian, and other Christian churches receive the sacraments and Communion without a profession of faith. Is what he says Church teaching or his own the-ology?

Dear Judy, It sounds to me as if your priest is trying to be responsive to pastoral needs in his parish, but his interpretation does not fully reflect Catholic teaching.

Several criteria exist for non-Catholics to receive the sacraments of Communion, penance, and anointing in the Catholic Church: They must request the sacraments on their own, agree with a Catholic belief regarding these sacraments, and be in serious need without access to their own ministers (see Canon Law 844; *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1401; and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Guidelines for the Reception of Communion).

These criteria point more to extraordinary circumstances than to regular practice. Your question, however, doesn't mention a situation of serious need.

A second point deals with practices addressed in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), which provides for the baptism of catechumens and the reception of baptized Christians in full communion with the Catholic Church. If the children are being received into the Catholic Church along with their parents, they are already baptized Christians, and a profession or renewal of baptismal faith is required before they may receive sacraments.

I think your priest misunderstands the Church's theology about sacramental sharing. Most Protestant traditions allow sacramental sharing if one is baptized and believes in Christ, but the Catholic Church does not allow sacramental sharing except in the circumstances outlined above. Country Store: Suggested items – fresh & canned vegetables, noodles, pies & handmade items such as pot holders, aprons, cup towels, etc.

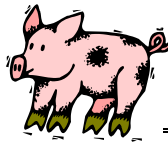
Pickles, cakes & kolaches are needed for the kitchen. Please bring them to the kitchen on Sunday morning.

Coca Cola Model T Go-Cart donated by Johnnie & Patricia Scherer

This half scale Model T Go-Cart, which was a part of Coca Cola's promotion in 1983, is a collector's item. The go-cart has forward, reverse and neutral, is in good running condition with a 3-1/2 HP engine, and comes with original owner's manual. It measures approximately 3 ft. wide by 6 ft. long.
