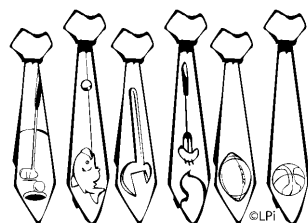

Priests For Life Rev. Denis G. Wilde, OSA, has been invited by the Hallettsville Knights of Columbus Council #2433 to speak at their KC Hall on Sunday, June 29. The public is invited to this event, which will begin at 7 p.m.

Father Wilde will be coming to Texas from Drexel Hill, PA where he works from his home for Priests for Life. He will concentrate his Sunday evening talk on the Four P’s of Pro-life: Prayer, Persuasion, Presence and Politics, while including an overview of the 30-plus years of the abortion culture in homilies at the Saturday and Sunday, June 28 and 29, Masses in Hallettsville.

**Cycles of Faith – 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time:**

How often have you heard the phrase “ordinary people doing extraordinary things”? Our history is filled with such people, and all around us you can see them today. There are the doctors and nurses who routinely save lives; teachers who shoulder most of the responsibility of educating our young people; or even the thousands of people who participate in countless fundraising events to try to help eradicate deadly diseases. Their calling comes from within.

Today’s Gospel reading from Matthew tells of Jesus’ act of selecting His twelve disciples. So filled with compassion at the sight of thousands of people who came to hear His word, He prayed for and received “shepherds for the flocks.” But in the same vein as His humble beginnings, Jesus did not seek those who spoke with authority of the orthodox laws, but rather His disciples were ordinary men called to do the most extraordinary thing.

Would you answer such a call? We have, in fact, already been called! The apostles handed down the gift of love in Christ, a treasure we are entrusted with to pass down to our children and everywhere in the world open to God’s word (CCC 3). If we turn to God with all of the trust and faith promised by Jesus and delivered through the Holy Spirit, we have made real the kingdom of heaven. What an extraordinary accomplishment!
