From the Desk of Father John

Continuation of 10 Things That Make for a Great Catholic Mom:

Share and share alike (Luke 3:10-14). When our kids are little, one of the first lessons we try to instill in them is sharing. By preschool, many kids are pretty good at sharing, and we switch our focus to teaching other skills. But the truth is that even for adults, sharing is not easy. Moms can be great models of sharing by including kids in clean-out and donation efforts. It is important to cultivate a spirit of giving that encourages sharing our material goods, money and time with people who are struggling or less fortunate. Some ideas: When a new toy comes in, choose an old one to give away. Donate old school clothes to a homeless shelter before buying new clothes in the fall. Talk about how much is "enough." Do we need ten pairs of jeans – or would we be okay with five? How might I help to "cultivate a spirit of giving" in my family? *Is generosity a value in our home?*

Laugh (Proverbs 17:22)! In the Old Testament, when Sarah gives birth to Isaac at a very advanced age, she says, "God has brought laughter for me; everyone who hears will laugh with me" (Gen 21:6). Even the ancients knew that motherhood would be filled with laughter. There is no greater joy than laughing with our children. Laughter is also a great stress reliever. Some mothers say that on days when they can either laugh or cry, they always choose to laugh. So the next time the whole Cheerios box has been dumped out onto the kitchen floor or the school outfit they put together themselves is plaid on top and stripes on the bottom – say a little prayer, and then have a good laugh. Motherhood isn't easy, but it sure can be fun. When was the last time I had a good laugh? Do I appreciate the joy in the day-to-day reality of motherhood?

Thank you, dear Lord, for the miraculous vocation of motherhood You have blessed me with. At times, I may not be able to fathom the intensity of the miracles that are worked in human hearts throughout the seasons of my vocation as mother. By Your grace and love for me, I trust that I act as Your instrument in this world – first to my own family and then, reaching out to others. Please continue to work through me as I work out my own salvation and that of my family. Help me to lead others to You by my life and love. – From Catholic Prayer Book for Mothers

6th Sunday of Easter

The old spiritual, "Twelve Gates to the City," takes the image of today's second reading from the Book of Revelation and celebrates it in song. The symbolism of a new Jerusalem, in which everyone is welcome, was first proclaimed by the prophet Isaiah. The author of the Book of Revelation reiterates this at the end of his apocalyptic vision. The spiritual builds on this theme, emphasizing, "Oh, what a beautiful city, hallelujah."

As the author of Revelation makes clear in today's selection, there is no temple or sun or moon in this new Jerusalem. The Lord is the temple and the glory of God is the city's light. This is God's dwelling among His people.

The Gospel of John for today makes the presence of the Lord even clearer. Jesus tells His disciples, "Whoever loves Me will keep My word, and My Father will love

him, and we will come to Him and make our dwelling with Him" (Jn 14:23). Through baptism God dwells in us – an amazing truth that may escape us in the midst of daily life.



We want to be with God. We try to live our lives in such a way that we will come at last to the heavenly city, the new and eternal Jerusalem. And that end-of-life focus is good. We need to be prepared for our final day. But God already dwells among us, as Jesus told His disciples as they were gathered in the upper room for the Last Supper. The Lord is here in our midst, now. We are no longer only hoping for a final dwelling with God in heaven. If God is already dwelling in our midst, then every baptized person that stands before us is Christ. If that is the case, then we are no longer just being nice to someone because that is the polite thing to do. Instead, we are giving honor and glory to God by the respect we show.

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
