The Catholic Church has listed certain specific duties of Catholics. These duties are basic obligations we have as Catholics and are known as precepts of the Church.

Two of the precepts are: you shall confess your sins at least once a year; and, you shall humbly receive the Lord Jesus in Holy Communion at least during the Easter Season.

Every Catholic should receive the Sacrament of Penance once a year. To lead a sacramental life, we should receive the Sacrament of Penance regularly, much more often than once a year. You have a wonderful opportunity this week with the Penance Service Monday evening and other scheduled confessions to make a good confession.

Every Catholic should receive Holy Communion in connection with the central mystery of the faith: the passion, death, and resurrection of the Lord. In addition to the Easter Season, you should receive Holy Communion frequently, preferably every time you participate in the Eucharist, provided you are in the state of grace free from mortal sin.

- Fr. Tommy's Corner -

The Creed (continued) - Currently we profess that the Son is "eternally begotten" of the Father. In the new translation we will profess that the Son is "born of the Father before all ages." The words "before all ages" gives us the correct sense that the Son existed with the Father even before time was created. The use of the word "born" of the Father, is not meant to indicate that at one time the Son did not exist (until he was "born" of the Father). Instead, the word "born" here simply designates the unique relationship that God the Father has with God the Son. This relationship of generation is what distinguishes the Father (who eternally begets the Son) from the Son (who is eternally begotten of the Father). It reminds us that ultimately the Triune God lives outside the space of time and the divine relationships between the Persons of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit have been, are, and will be unique, distinct, mysterious, and always and eternally existing. The point that the Son has always existed with the Father was contested by a heretical (wrong believing) priest named Arius, who taught that "at one time, the Son was not." Or simply put, there was a time when the Son did not exist. Arius wrongly believed and taught that Jesus "earned" His way to becoming the Son of God. Arius ultimately did not believe that Jesus was by nature God, but that Jesus was elevated to become God-like, because Jesus obeyed the will of the Father so perfectly. It is necessary to believe that the Son of God who is the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity who is Jesus Christ has always existed equally with the Father and is no lesser God than God the Father. Because not to believe correctly about this part of who Jesus is, will end up causing us to believe wrongly about how Jesus redeemed us.
