THE WORD OF GOD

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings: 2 Samuel 12:7-10,13 Psalm 32:1-2,5,7,11 Galatians 2:16,19-21 Luke 7:36-8:3 or 7:36-50

David acknowledges his son and experiences the Lord's forgiveness. The sinful woman is forgiven by Jesus because of her great love. He loves us and gave himself up for us.

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings: Zechariah 12:10-11;13:1 Psalm 63:2-6,8-9 Galatians 3:26-29 Luke 9:18-24

We believe the prophecy of Zechariah to be fulfilled in Jesus, the Messiah, who had to endure suffering and death on a cross. By being baptized into his death, we are called to take up his cross and follow in his steps, and to seek the God for whom we long.

The Nativity of John the Baptist

Readings: Isaiah 49:1-6 Psalm 139:1b-3,13-15 Acts 13:22-26 Luke 1:57-66,80

Called from birth by the Lord, John matured in the Spirit and heralded the advent of the Messiah. This feast dating from the 4th century in both East and West, came to be celebrated in accord with Luke 1:36, six months before the Lord's birth: quoting John 3:30, Augustine found this date (near the summer solstice) appropriate for, after the birth of John, daylight begins to grow shorter, whereas after Jesus' birth, it begins to increase.

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings: 1 Kings 19:16b,19-21 Psalm 16:1-2,5,7-11 Galatians 5:1,13-18 Luke 9:51-62

Elisha is summoned to follow the prophet Elijah and to succeed him. Jesus insists that those who follow him must abandon all material or psychological securities, walking ever forward without looking back. It is the Lord alone who is to hold fast our lot. Paul distinguishes between true freedom and license.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We'd like our children to be perfect angels. As parents, we spend a lot of time teaching them proper manners, coaching them on moral behavior, and helping them understand right from wrong. And while we would like everything they do to be good and right, we know that sometimes our sons and daughters have to learn from their mistakes. We just hope and pray that the mistakes in their lives are minor and give them an education, as opposed to serious problems that lead to calamitous results. Sometimes, as parents, we have to take a stand (tough love, some call it) as a way of holding firm to certain principles of behavior.

The woman in the Gospel today is described as a sinner, although Luke never specifies the actual sin. We like to imagine the worst -adultery, harlotry. Maybe we do that because if she's guilty of really awful sins (after all, Jesus said that her many sins were forgiven), then she's not quite like us. We can stand on the side of righteousness - just like the Pharisee! (Whoops! Is that really the side we want to be on?)

Well, yes, it is. We do want to be on the side of righteousness. But we don't want to be on the side of self-righteousness. That is the delicate balance that each of us must strike. When our own children behave badly, we have to be prepared with correction. But we also have to be ready with forgiveness. Mercy is also one of the certain principles of Christian life. And just as God's justice is tempered with eternal mercy, so must our own desire for the right be guided by a merciful love. It's not always an easy balance to strike, but as we'll hear throughout this year as we read from Luke's Gospel, God's mercy is without limit or end. Happy Father's Day next Sunday!

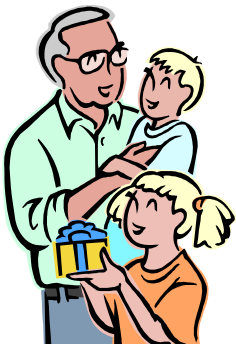
