Answers to last month's Commandments/ Beatitudes Quiz are as follows: 1) (A) This saying comes from Matthew 5:38-39. Jesus' followers would have been familiar with the old law that Jesus is quoting. You can read it in Leviticus 24:19. But he's bringing them a new law, urging his followers to be peacemakers; 2) (A) Cain & Abel were the sons of Adam & Eve. Cain murdered his brother Abel out of anger and jealousy. See Genesis 4:3-8; 3) (B) The Bible tells us that the commandments were written on stone tablets by the finger of God. See Exodus 31:18; 4) (C) In Matthew 5:1, we read that Jesus gave the Beatitudes to his disciples. Disciple is a word that means "student" and is used to describe those who hear and listen to the teaching of Jesus, not only in New Testament times, but in all ages.

Greetings! May we be filled with God's Holy Spirit as we continue to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to all we meet.

The Diocesan Catechetical Office will again sponsor a **Catholic Knowledge Bowl** scheduled for **Sunday, January 25, 2009** at **Holy Family Parish** in Victoria from **1:30 to 4:30 p.m.** This year's bowl will include teams of adults, teens and families. The registration fee is \$20 per team and the deadline for registering is January 16, 2009. Everyone is encouraged to register early because there is a limited amount of space.

All persons interested in forming a team are invited to do so. **Adult teams** can be made up of individuals, catechists, Knights of Columbus, Catholic Daughters, ACTS, etc. **Teen teams** can be made up of youth group members, school friends, etc. **Family teams** can be made up of parents, children, grandparents, aunts, etc. (Family teams must include one or more children.)

Study questions, contest information, and registration forms are posted on the diocesan website. The purpose for this event is to encourage adults and youth alike to study their faith.

Clergy, religious, and diocesan personnel cannot be team members, but we will again be counting on their help to monitor participants and check the answers for each round.

Admit it – you are already making yourselves crazy, what with decorations and gifts and special meals and travel plans, not to mention sending out the cards and annual letters. Some of you may even be thinking, "I'll be glad when all of this is over!" though I certainly hope not! Think back to those days over 2,000 years ago; under the quiet cover of night's darkness, a young couple set out on a journey. There was nothing of what we've added to this season, only quiet anticipation and prayer as they slowly made their way to an as yet unknown destination.

The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four, but is often described as the most striking and descriptive. Today's reading, from the beginning of the book, introduces us to John the Baptist. He is described as a voice of one, crying out in the desert, announcing to everyone who will hear him that the Messiah is coming. Imagine

the excitement of those who listened to John; after centuries of waiting, the Christ was coming to baptize with the promised Holy Spirit.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes St. John the Baptist as "the Lord's immediate precursor or forerunner, sent to prepare his way" (CCC 523). Indeed, he was the last of the prophets to proclaim the coming of Jesus Christ. Appearing with the characteristics of an Old Testament prophet, this holiest of men had waited all of his life for the moment when he could announce the coming of the Savior. He was patient; he was faithful. During this Advent season, as we remember the promise of a Savior who would save us from our sins, let us pray for patience and faith through the Holy Spirit. Now is the time for peace in our lives and in our hearts.
